Characteristics and functions

In the early 1960s Kodak presented a cartridge film called "Kodapak".

In 1970 this camera produced and marketed by Agfa with the name 'ISO-PAK'.

The ISO-PAK uses the new rigid magazine film and provides 28x28mm images. The only possible adjustment is the choice of the shutter speed: 1/80" by moving the selector to the 'Full Sun' symbol; 1/40" when the selector is positioned on the 'Cloudy' symbol.

The diaphragm is fixed: f/11. The meniscus lens has a 42mm focal length and the focus is 'Focus Free' type.

On the upper side there are the charging lever, the shutter button and the socket for using the Flash Cube. The power supply for the use of the flash is provided by two 1.5v. type PX825 button batteries. located in the appropriate compartment on the bottom side of the camera. At the center of the bottom side is the threaded hole for using the stand. On the right side of the ISO-PAK there is a button for opening the back door and attaching the wrist strap.
