### Characteristics and Functions

The "Panorama Head II" was introduced in 1979 with the previous company logo in small letters (minolta), replacing the first "Panorama Head" version. With the updating of the logo, the inscription on the body of the panoramic head II has been changed, which is now in capital letters with the rising sun in the "O". The Panorama Head II allows you to take 360 ° panoramic photographs. Using the subdivision  $f = 100\text{mm.} - 85 - 50 - 35 - 28$  it is possible to take contiguous shots by attaching the corresponding lenses to the camera.

By placing the panoramic head on a tripod, you can perform a leveling using the appropriate spirit level, then lock the camera in the appropriate thread. By making the lower white point coincide with the chosen focal length (for example 50mm.), The head remains calibrated so that with each click in rotation of the satin metal part, a positioning of the camera is obtained for a frame contiguous to the previous one. By making the two white points coincide, on the other hand, there is a free and continuous rotation of the satin-finished metal support, which is also useful in video shooting.
