

# POLAROID Land Camera Model 110 (Pathfinder)



<b>Year of construction:</b>	1952-1957
<b>Film type:</b>	Roll-film – Type 42 (200iso), 47 (3000iso)
<b>Shutter:</b>	1" - 1/400", plus B and T (Wollensak Rapax),
<b>Meter:</b>	EV 10 to EV 17
<b>Diaphragm:</b>	f/4.5, f/5.4, f/8, f/11, f/16, f/22, f/32
<b>Times:</b>	From 1/400" to 1"
<b>Lens:</b>	127mm, f/4.5 (4-element Wollensak Raptor)
<b>Flash synchronisation:</b>	M, X sync via a bi-pin sync connector
<b>Self-timer:</b>	No
<b>Focusing:</b>	Manual with distance scale (3,5" to Infinity)
<b>Characteristics:</b>	Folding viewfinder, with collapsible manually-set wire frame parallax compensation device.
<b>Accessories:</b>	Coupled Kalart rangefinder mounted on top of body next to viewfinder. Top of rangefinder has an exposure calculator for converting Polaroid "Light Value" numbers to/from equivalent conventional shutter speed and aperture settings.
<b>Note:</b>	Polished steel and/or chromium body with black textured covering.
<b>Estimated Production:</b>	14,000 – 21,000
